Thank God for the Rhodenizer's gift and ask that God show us how to use it wisely.

As another search team is gathered, pray that God will move in the hearts of those He has chosen to participate in it. Pray that the team will work well together, that God will guide all that they do, and that God's man will come here in God's timing.

We praise God for Pastor Brad and Pastor Phil as well as all of our staff. Pray that they will keep their eyes focused on God and feel His presence, protection and love. Pray for all of the boards and ministries of our church as they reorganize with new members. Ask God to give them wisdom and unity, patience and endurance, and that they will see fruit from their efforts. Ask God to show you how you can help.

I am convinced that if we all pray faithfully our mighty God will do mighty works within and through us. Please remember that your elders are always available to answer your questions and receive your input.

Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

BECAUSE GOD IS EVER-PRESENT...I AM NEVER ALONE

September 20th 1994 is a day that has forever changed my life. It was the day that my sister and only sibling Carol Lynne died along with her husband Gerald Hunter in a car accident on a small country road. I will never forget the phone call from my wife telling me to get to my parents home quickly there had been a terrible accident involving my sister! It was the longest drive to mom and dad's I had ever made, minutes seemed like hours, and the entire way home I found myself descending deeper into my thoughts, "is this true?" "Could this really be happening?" "What will I say to mom and dad?" "What will happen to my niece and nephews?" "Oh God, Father are you here, I feel so alone!" Later in the day, we found ourselves there as a family, along with our many friends trying their best to help with hugs and words of encouragement, but the truth was that all of us felt alone and so paralyzed in our pain and shock that we didn't know what to say.

That is when I started thinking, why did the accident happen today? Why not tomorrow? Why didn't it take place in the morning instead of the afternoon? What if the truck that they collided with had left the yard just 30 seconds earlier or later, none of this would have happened. After mulling these questions repeatedly in my mind, it struck me, all the timing had to be perfect for these two vehicles to collide! Though we all were shocked with surprise by this tragedy, and emotionally undone by the suddenness of the event, God was not! The one who controls time was completely aware of the timing; He was completely aware of the event. The difficult reality is that God was there! He was there with me on my way to my parents. He was there when I called out, "Father, are you here?" God was there in that room full of comforting friends when we felt so alone; He was there! He was there with my sister and her husband when He took them by the hand and brought them home to Himself. Moreover, He has been there for our family everyday since.

You see God is always here, right where you are, all the time. Nothing takes Him by surprise, nothing that happens to us happens in a vacuum. No matter whom you are, or whether you believe me or not, God is always there. And you and I are never out there on our own. In Psalm 139, David, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit declares this truth,

"7) Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? 8) If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. 9) If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea... 11) If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,"12) even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you."

And further the Bible teaches that even those who don't believe in God's existence are still in His sight!

Hebrews 4:13 "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

So, what this means is that we are never, no matter what the situation, out of God's loving presence. Keeping that in mind let me ask you some tough questions. Where are you right now in your life? Are you alone, without friends or relationships? Are you alone in the bitterness of anger, or alone in your fear and distrust of others? Are you alone in a diseased mindset that you're going to somehow slip into the darkness and be lost? Do you feel alone in depression and yet cannot explain why? No matter where you are, you are not alone, God is there! You can call to Him and He will answer! He may answer through the love of a friend. He may choose to reveal Himself through His word, the Bible. He may show Himself to you in a church service. God may choose different ways to let you know He is there with you. Nevertheless, in every way, He will show Himself to you as He already has, in Jesus Christ! Jesus has promised that those who trust in Him, He would never leave nor forsake even in car accidents, even where you may feel the most alone right now. He's there, call out! You are not alone!



DIACONATE

What is the Diaconate Board?

The Diaconate Board consists of Deacons and Deaconesses who share spiritual ministry responsibilities.

The Diaconate Board derives its title from the Greek word diakonos meaning servant. Their charge is to promote the physical well-being of the congregation and support its worship. The Diaconate shall give its foremost attention to assisting those in our congregation who are widows, fatherless, poor, needy, sick, friendless, or distressed. The Board is also to minister to those outside the congregation whom the Lord may direct to us for help.

The Diaconate oversees many ministries in our church and depends on the faithful service of many from our congregation. Some of the areas that Diaconate oversees are: communion, prayer chain, meals to sick and needy, ushers, greeters, cards, flowers, visitation, transportation, scholarship fund, benevolence gifts, serving at City Mission and Baptist Health Nursing Home, Dorcas, Flannelgraph, Hospitality, shoebox ministry, baby bottle collection, holiday food drive, backpack drive and Junior Diaconate.
