Pastor Brad and Leigh intend to remain with us until a new Senior Pastor is ready to begin serving here.

Pastor's Corner

Renewed By a Son's Freedom



"Jesus replied, 'I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever.'" ~ John 3:34-35

Once thought about joining the Navy, but the truth is, that lingering thought passed by pretty quickly! I figured I love the water, I love boats, and I'm interested in different places, why not? Well, the answer came to my mind the moment I realized I wouldn't be able to get off the ship any time I liked. I would be trapped and unable to walk around. I would have limits and I couldn't tell the Captain it's time to take me ashore.

As you might guess, confinement really bothers me. But I think many of us feel this way. I don't know anyone in their right mind who really enjoys being trapped, especially trapped by situations. The worst entrapment of all is the enslavement of our hearts; the feeling that we are stuck in an emotional or physical condition which there is no freedom in sight. When we feel bound, one of the first reaction is panic which soon becomes desperation and desperate people often do desperate things which most likely bring a deeper struggle. Perhaps you can recall a vision of a trapped animal; it's thrashing about inflicts more harm to itself. It is in this vision that we have the picture of our lives bound in the confinement of sin.

After we are exhausted from our situations, it seems our hearts sink into resignation. We resign not only to our circumstances, but worse, we resign from hope. Resignation becomes our new norm and slavery becomes more a reality than freedom. Often those who have

spent a significant amount of time being incarcerated become so used to their imprisoned environment that the thought of freedom becomes a staggering terror. As we intuitively know, there is much more to being incarcerated than just bars. We also know that there are many more manifestations of prisons than those made of bars. There are the jails of loneliness, embitterment, fear and reticence; the bars of addictions, reputations, lost dreams... The point is: we can get so resigned to our lives being this way that the thought of breaking out and living in freedom is too terrifying to imagine.

What we need is a redeemer instead of a warden! Jesus proclaims that He has come to set the captives free. He also states that if He has announced your freedom then you are most certainly free, but before our hearts can even begin to step from our houses of penitentiary and the labor camps of the heart we've grown accustomed to we must first know His motivation for our freedom. The motivation of His declaration is both simple and daring at the same time. It is in the beauty of His affections for you.

Jesus really does love you! He loves you with the compassionate love a parent has for their injured child. I have counseled with many families of which their loved ones were enslaved to some type of addictions. I can speak to the hope they feel for the

day of their loved one's release. I have seen firsthand the sacrifices made to purchase the freedom of their loved ones, but I can only scratch the surface of the elation they feel when that release of their loved one becomes a reality. Their rejoicing is not over the struggle being gone, nor for the salvation of their reputations, rather the elation is because the one they love is free. It is this kind of abiding love Jesus has for us.

Jesus' declaration of our freedom is daring in that we really have to trust that Jesus loves us the way He says He does. Jesus does not leave us in a blind trust decision, but gives us the greatest display of His trustworthy love on the cross. When all else seek to cage you, whenever people or circumstances lock up your heart, Jesus proclaims; dare to trust the evidence of My love for you on the cross more. It is at the cross that we can dare to step out into the freedom Jesus has provided. The really great thing about freedom from Jesus is that there are no boundaries; we are endless in the places we have to wander in His heart. There are no fetters, no bars, and no blocks for assignments; only an endless range of grace in which we stroll without constraint. In the Son there is renewal in His freedom and Jesus as the highest authority has made you free, therefore, you are free indeed!

Take me from my places of entrapment and release me into the vast range of your boundless grace. Jesus, I love you! Help me to trust that you love me more than I could ever define. Lord set me free so that I may be free indeed!

Update from the Short Term Missions Team

Our long-awaited trip is fast approaching and we are getting excited at the opportunity to share the gospel in a foreign country. We want to extend a deep appreciation to all those who have come along on the journey thus far, encouraging and supporting us each step of the way.

Our June 1st performance event at BH-BL High School represented a desire to see local Christians uniting as a result of their common beliefs, rather than remaining disconnected because of our differences. The pure Gospel message that we will be sharing on the mission field is as simple as it gets: God loved us so much that He sent Jesus to die on our behalf, so that those who believe in Him will not die, but live forever. This truth is the Good News that changes lives.

Each of us will be paired with a translator so that we can effectively communicate this message to lost souls. To offer a glimpse of that cultural experience to the congregation, we are sharing the precious words of The Lord's Prayer in the Spanish language.

Men's Ministry, Where Iron Sharpens Iron

The Men's Ministry at EGCC has traditionally consisted of a mid-week Bible Study and occasional breakfasts that include healthy portions of food, a short message and an opportunity to catch up with one another and attempt to solve the problems of the world ... you know, like guys do at breakfast! Our intention is to support the vision of the church, which is to love God, love people, and to help people become followers of Jesus.

Love God

The primary outlet for growing in God on a corporate level happens at the Wednesday Night Bible Study. That is a bridge to the teaching that is provided through Sunday School and the Sunday morning message. The Men's Ministry recognizes that this does not come remotely close to addressing the necessary consumption of God's word or the outpouring of our love, adoration and obedience to our eternal king. The foundational expectation for those who participate in Men's Ministry activities is that they are reading scripture daily, praying multiple

times a day and meditating on God's Word and what His will is for our lives. Men are encouraged to grow through daily spiritual disciplines in order to breathe life into others. Love People

The most significant event this year that helped us to love other folks was when we participated in the church outreach to the community. The group of four that I was a part of went into the community near the church and prayed with people in 12 different households. Between all of the church ministries, hundreds of invitations were extended to neighbors to attend our Easter service.

Starting last year, we had men pair up to be prayer partners. Hopes were that the Holy Spirit would drive that and lead these

men into accountability and mentoring relationships.

Loving People comes down to the individual man being filled with God's Holy Spirit to love others and proclaim the Good News of the Gospel to others. The Men's Ministry cannot institutionalize that, but rather encourage and walk alongside any God-fearing man being convicted to do God's will.

Help People Become Followers of Jesus

This is happening on an individual basis. Men's Ministry at its finest is man to man. Iron sharpening iron. This is where we can be transparent and come under the authority of Jesus and abide in His commands.

DIACONATE ...in service to Christ and the Body

Our love and service to one another in the church is a mark of a Christian. Because we are a family, we help one another. The kind of help a person needs will vary from one person to the next, but it includes providing for one’s physical needs, praying, helping and serving with our time and labor, and sharing with others what we have.

“I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me, says the Lord Almighty” (2 Cor. 6:18).

It means providing a meal to a family where there is an illness or birth of a baby. It means giving a ride or lending a car when a friend can’t afford to repair their broken down one. It means offering to babysit when a friend is sick. It means mowing the yard for the elderly. It means having a meal with or making a phone call to the lonely. It means sharing clothing, toys, and other material possessions. It may even mean opening our home to a friend in need.

“So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith” (Gal. 6:10).

On the night of His betrayal, Jesus did something unthinkable. He got down on hands and knees and washed the disciples’ feet (John 13:2-5). Washing feet was a servant’s job; a job for the non-Jew. It was a degrading job. That the God of the universe would lower himself to serve in this way is remarkable and humbling. It was an act of love for his disciples, including his enemy, the one who was about to betray him. When Jesus finished washing their feet, he got up and said,

“Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you.” (John 13:12-14).

Our Lord set an example for us of what it means to serve one another. When we help and serve our brothers and sisters by meeting their physical needs, we ultimately reflect what our Savior has done for us. In fact, our love and service to one another in the church is the mark of a Christian. It is how the world knows that we belong to Christ.



Pastor Brad often refers to living with palms wide open. Offering up our lives completely to the Lord, ready to receive and respond to that which He brings into our lives with trust that He is in control and cares for every aspect of our lives. That image convicts me of my tendency to pretend that I am in control, or need to be in control of my life. And, as we read the scriptures, we see how many times Jesus talks about money, and our need to trust God with it. He knows our hearts. He knows how I am afraid to live with

palms wide open; to trust that He will provide as I respond to His calling on my life. He talks so much about money because He knows that we often look to it as our security, rather than to Him. *Dear Lord, please help me to live with palms wide open, like the poor widow who trusted completely in your provision for her life.*

Our finances have improved over the last month or so, but we continue to be behind our budget, and last year's income by about 10%. Our cash flow is

stable as we are spending roughly what we are bringing in. We are trusting that God knows exactly where we are financially and has a purpose for everything. The missionaries that EGCC supports frequently express their gratefulness for the funds we send, but all emphasize that our prayers are most important for them. Here are some updates so that you and your family can pray for our missionaries:

Nathan Caldwell was in Colombia exploring the possibility of starting Camp Duffel in that country, but now is in Mexico busily running six weeks of camps.

Matt Paschall and family are home on furlough, taking a much-needed rest but also connecting with supporting churches. Matt will preach here on Sunday, July 29. Our short-term missions team will be home then and ready to report on all that God did in Cuba.

Gordon and Sara Williams each accepted new positions with SIL, an arm of Wycliffe Bible Translators in January. They ask for our prayer as The Seed Company just asked them to return to Senegal to head up their work in West Africa. This major decision must be made by the end of May.

Paul and Nanette Holt recently spoke to a group of our church members, telling

about their ministry to international students. Having these young people come to faith in Christ on our college campuses and then return home to their native lands is a vital mission field today.

Alex Crum is excited to have two new employees helping with his work at Wycliffe Bible Translators. They will be traveling soon to Thailand.

Both **Mark Wilson** and **John Morris** have health struggles. We pray for them

and their wives, **Rae** and **Gail**.

In March the members of the Missions Board sent personal notes to all of our missionaries. The replies of our “retired” people were touching. Currently there are 12 couples or widows who have returned from their appointed fields but are still finding many ways to serve their Lord and His people where they are living in the States. Despite physical handicaps and “older” age their faithfulness is still an example and encouragement.

Reaching beyond the local congregation for the purpose of fulfilling the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) is of paramount importance to us. We partner with mission agencies, send out our own people, and connect with indigenous peoples all over the world to accomplish this end. All of our current and retired missionaries, as well as our local missions efforts, are examples of how we reach out to our community and world with the love of Christ.



Summer is here! The end of another great year at East Glenville Christian Preschool.

This year we had 29 students in our four-year-old class, 18 in the three-year-old class and 8 in the two-year-old class. This was the first full year of the two-year-old class. We started it last year as a pilot program for half the year and it was very successful.

We will continue with the same classes in September. Two-year-old class goes from October through May. It meets on Monday and/or Friday from 9:15-10:45. Teachers are Carol Bradley and Emma Squires.

Three-year-old classes meet from 9:00-11:30 on Monday and Tuesday with an optional Wednesday class.

Media & Sound Team

Video Production

We have been researching and working towards the purchase and installation of a new video camera to enable a live video feed of our service. This camera would serve a number of functions. It would

greatly enhance our worship by projecting images from the platform that are hard to see from the pews (i.e. the Children's Message and Praise Gang) to the big screen. It could also be sent to a 'cry room' where parents of children who are unable to stay in the service could watch. Finally it could be used for a live online video feed of our service if/when that was desired. Our hope is to have this up and running next fall but we will need a few individuals who are willing to help run the projector from time to time. There will be Sundays when it is completely stationary, but other Sundays when we need projection in the service and we'll need someone to run it.


