### Pastor's Message

As I write this article my mind is still on my message from last Sunday on John 6, *Bread in the Desert*. I feel like there is still so much left to say, so rather than inflicting you with an hourlong sermon I want to highlight some points here.

First: The idea of the Son of God being given as the Bread of Life, is similar to the teaching in John 4 where Jesus offers the Living Water. In both cases it talks about gaining an inner satisfaction from God in a way that this world could not offer. We so often end up seeking happiness from something we see in this world. What Jesus is saying that by coming to Him and connecting to God, the Father will bring a lasting peace and joy, not a fleeting thrill.

Second: One difference between the Living Water vs. the Bread of Life teaching is that the Living Water is poured out upon those who seek Christ, while the Bread of Life must be consumed by one who wants to receive it. In this way, the Living Water is picturing for us the work of the Holy Spirit, which wells up from within leading to eternal life. While Christ is sent by God to give himself, his flesh, his life for the world. In other words, the Bread of Life is "consumed" as Christ's body was broken apart like a loaf of bread. We receive Christ and take him into our life just as if he was bread that we have eaten.

Third: The Bread of Life is given so that we might have eternal life. Jesus says the work God has for us to do is to "believe in the one whom God has sent," meaning in Jesus the only Son of God. But the word believe is not just an acknowledgment or mental assent but it means to put our faith in or to trust in Jesus. We do that by receiving Him into our life. We do that by trusting that walking with Christ is better than anything this world has to offer. We put our faith for our salvation in Him. At times we can be tempted to think we can fix things in our life by ourselves, or think that achieving some status level will be the one thing that we need. But when we trust in Christ we believe what he says in 6:27 - Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you.

Fourth: In this final point I just want to reiterate one of the key points from this past Sunday. Jesus chose to distribute the bread to the people through his disciples. John's gospel simply says that Jesus dis-

tributed the bread to the crowd, which is accurate because the source of the multiplied loaves was Christ. Yet, Mark's gospel explains that he gave the bread to the disciples who in turn gave it to the people. This is still how it works. The Bread of Life is available to all who are hungry. Among the crowds are people who are spiritually hungry, and yet are trying to find their life in the things of this world and are realizing that won't work. We, who have come to find our life in Christ, are called and empowered to share the bread of Christ with the crowds. We are not to retreat to our own safe places and hoard what little we have for ourselves. We need not fear, there is enough for all. We can give Christ away to others and actually find we have more of Him ourselves, and that we know him better by participating in the Kingdom work of sharing the good news of Jesus. As it says in the gospel accounts that when it was all over, they gathered twelve basketfuls of bread, enough for each disciple.
